
Save the Exam Schools, Save the City Stop Discrimination by Zip Code

- ☐ On October 8th, Exam Schools Admission Working Group provided a new recommendation for the admission of exam schools without going through any public hearing. Key points from the recommendation include:
- 1. Suspend "Exam" as a 50% criteria for entrance to Boston Latin School, Boston Latin Academy and O'Bryant School .
- 2. Reserve 20% seats at the three exam schools based on straight GPA rank.
- 3. Assign <u>80%</u> of seats by percentage of school-age children in Boston zip code. Use a GPA straight rank within each zip code, <u>prioritizing zip codes</u> with the lowest median household income first.

School Committee will vote on the recommendation on Wednesday October 21st!



Impacts and Consequences

- The method relies on subjective, rather than objective, criteria to evaluate incoming students for the exam schools, which will undermine the education quality towards academic excellence and competitiveness.
- The distribution of incoming seats based on median house income is a discriminatory measure against equal opportunity for all students
- Property values will diminish in neighborhoods like West Roxbury since families will choose to move out of the neighborhood
