AFFIDAVIT OF WILLIAM GROSS

William Gross, on oath, hereby states as follows:

- I am the former Commissioner of the Boston Police Department, and make this affidavit based on my personal knowledge.
- 2. In January 2014, I was the Superintendent-in-Chief of the Boston Police
 Department ("Chief"), the second highest ranking officer in the Boston Police Department
 ("BPD"). At that time, the BPD Commissioner was William Evans ("Evans").
- 3. In January 2014, Evans and I were responsible for reviewing and preliminarily approving candidates for promotion to the BPD Command Staff, who included, among others, Dennis White ("White"). White was a candidate for promotion to Deputy Superintendent.

- 4. In January 2014, Superintendent Frank Mancini, who was the Commander of Internal Affairs, provided a copy of White's and the other candidates' IA files to Commissioner Evans and me.
 - 5. Evans and I looked at every candidate including their Internal Affairs ("IA") file.
 - 6. The Mayor of Boston must approve any candidate to the Command Staff.
- 7. Once Evans and I had the candidates for promotion selected, they were presented to Mayor Martin Walsh, who was briefed on each candidate and their IA history.
- 8. There is no way anyone is brought onto the Command Staff without such a briefing to the Mayor and approval by the Mayor.
- The City, including Mayor Walsh, was aware no later than January 2014 of White's IA record.
